MOVING INTO UNCHARTERED TERRITORY

Welcome everyone to the year 2022. It's unfortunate that Covid-19 has affected community events that we all look forward to that kick off our new year. 2022 is full of unknowns for Andamooka. When will we finally get past Covid? What might change for town management and town funding? What will happen around events and community activities?

There is no doubt that we are entering unchartered territory around all this, but our community has a special resilience that always seems to get us through so much. So let's take advantage of change. If we concentrate on building new ways of doing things that will benefit our community, and we are prepared to put some time and effort into making these things work, we will collectively strengthen the town's foundation and build on the good things that have been put in place in the past.

The APOMA Committee have had to make some hard decisions in light of the total uncertainty around local advancement of Covid 19, and due to compliance with Level 1 Government restrictions that apply to our unique situation as a progress association managing a community, plus a town office staffed by part time paid workers and significant amount of volunteer labour. At their meeting on 10th February, the Committee put in place measures for Covid managing community programs and events, the Office, and community facilities until they can reassess the situation again in early March and make appropriate changes.

For the time being the town office will remain closed to the public, but staff will make themselves available by arrangement. Community facilities will remain closed to the public except for supervised events and activities.

Community social programs will progressively recommence, with the lapidary program being the first to kick off on the 19th February. The community bus will continue to function with restrictions and special conditions applied.

Office staff will work from home continuing to generally manage day to day functions and to move forward with planning community events and work on projects, and other staff will maintain services vital to the community. The Committee will keep the community informed of changes and any developments, as we all know that situations can change any time.

In March we will see things livening up. There will be a special free community event at the hall on the 5th March with all the sound and excitement of the Festival of Arts opening streamed live under an open night sky, surrounded by special light effects. Having the Dine-a-mite café opening again to be part of the night will offer some feeling of normality and connection for all. Keep an eye on their Facebook page for details.

Then before we know it April and Easter will be upon us and fingers crossed we can have our usual Easter celebrations, BBQ, market, with plans for a special event to present our postponed Australia Day awards.

These are challenging conditions for us as individuals and as a community, but the committee will continue to work as best we can in the interests of community wellbeing. We thank you for your support. Please stay safe and well and continue to take care of others. We will look forward to progressing out the other side of this.

KEEPING UP WITH BUSINESS

HEADING INTO 2022

This summer has been a paradox – on one hand the community keeping a low profile to avoid falling victim to the local Covid 19 outbreak. On the other hand, dealing with fires, a major flood event, and the consequent repairs and clean-ups, and at the same time experiencing a week without phone contact with the outside world due to Telstra undertaking maintenance. These odd and sometimes shocking events, have kept the committee and local emergency services busy, with the recent fire events imposing a negative impact on the town that will be felt for some time.

Fall-out has made many of our resident feel quite isolated and vulnerable. But, the good news is that Andamooka is livening up. Community programs will progressively start up with the Lapidary Shed kicking off on 19th February, and March will be another progressive month. With anticipated relaxing of Covid restrictions, and a whole set of exciting events occurring over the next couple of months and beyond.

Extraordinary events have created havoc last few months for projects and activities, so major projects on community facilities have been delayed by two months, but anticipated to be open to the community at the end of March. The Pump track is planned to be operational by July. The Minnie Berrington documentary filming is due to commence in June to take advantage of our clear winter light and cool weather. Work on props will recommence in March, lifting day to day activity around the town and dovetailing into development of our historic and discovery trails.

At last, our Decade By Decade exhibits counting down to Andamooka's 100yr anniversary in 2030/31 can get back on track. Work is commencing on a series of living history exhibits and activities about the 1930's-40's, spanning the discovery of opal to our early settlement, which will happen from Easter through to the October long weekend. Anyone who would like to volunteer some time or skills across a wide range of tasks and needs will be so appreciated – this is truly a whole of community project and it will finally succeed in tying our town's first 100 years of history together and recorded and filed for future generations.

A COMMUNITY MARKET PLACE WITH A COOPERATIVE HEART

In a quest to make our town a great place to live and to thrive, plans for our Community Market Place, to be located in the town hub, is to be finally up and running by Easter. This will be a progressive project and will grow as members of our community who are keen to promote or start up a small personal business or cottage industry join others in the Andamooka Collective. These ventures have proven successful in small towns across Australia – so why not ours?

The space will offer pop-up market stalls, exhibition space, workshop space and equipment, garden spaces, internet access and sales, a local point of sale, and marketing and sales support with the advantage of joint promotional ventures and having others keen to help you make things happen.

The new Tourist Information Centre will be part of the enterprise, and this will bring visitors and tourists into the space, also direct them to the promotional website and attract them to associated events.

This is designed to encourage locals to work cooperatively to enhance business opportunities for locals. There is so much hidden talent in our town and this needs to be unleashed... so if you are thinking of starting up a small business for yourself or a small group, anything from art to growing produce, this is your chance to make that happen.

A get-together of interested people is planned for the end of March, so watch out for posters and keep an eye on the Andamooka Hub and Arty Andamooka Facebook pages and other social media for more information. Or contact the town office from around mid-March for more details.

GRANTS & PROJECTS

Recreation, Sport and Youth Centre – the Centre is ready for community programs and activities to commence. The toilet block has been held up due to Covid delays in manufacture and delivery, and the local flood event. Delivery of this secure and functional facility which includes a baby change facility is expected in March. The base is nearing completion in readiness to drop the transportable unit and simply connect.

Regional Star Club, based in Roxby Downs will assist with getting junior sports up and running and an OCA Sports Grant will fund a basic kit of junior sports equipment.Funding will be sought for children's programs. Consultation will be undertaken after February with local families to explore, plan and prioritise activities.

'The Church' Community Centre – completion of this project has also been held up due to the local Covid outbreak and flood event. Work has progressed and it is anticipated that this Centre will be open for community programs and activities by the end of March. Thanks to an FRRR grant, an upgraded ambulant toilet facility has been installed under the main roof and easily accessed from the indoor space.

Pump Track – this is another project impacted by Covid, but this is on an international level. Due mainly to shipping, delivery has been delayed from April to June and the cost has increased meaning that we have around \$5000 less to spend on the project but we are negotiating some assistance to cover for this. A positive is that we will • now have an improved model Pump Track.

Community Market Place / Tourist Information Centre – work has started on this project supported by BHP, which has been put back around 5 months as a consequence of Covid outcomes and frustrating hold-ups for the relocation of seniors and youth. An open meeting will be called around late March or early April for locals who are it makes our volunteer efforts more rewarding. interested in getting involved.

This community enterprise will provide opportunities and facilities for producing, selling and display spaces, access to equipment, workshops and work space, and importantly to cooperative services and marketing for local artists, artisans, tourism based small business, and others who will benefit from affordable and supported options and opportunities to get their business / enterprise or ideas up and running. Also, to take advantage of promotions and sales under a banner which retains and protects their individual privacy. We look forward to making a start on this cooperative collective

Discovery Trails – Funding towards promotional and directional materials and signs for local tourist trails has allowed work to gradually progress. The cottages renovation and security measures have been completed, and features which will also support the local section of the Minnie Berrington Trail have progressed well and they are looking so good. These have also experienced delays due to Covid restrictions that have impacted availability of volunteers and the CDP, and by local flooding events.

Lapidary Shed veranda – funded by (Easternwell) this is yet another project impacted and delayed by Covid and floods. The kit has been delivered and it is anticipated that the veranda will be up and functional by Easter.

Other projects that have been put on the agenda for 2022 include:

FIGHT the BITE



HELP AT HAND TO HELP CONTROL MOSQUITOS & FIGHT THE BITE!

The *Fight the Bite* campaign is active across SA at present and Andamooka is getting involved. This ongoing campaign been recently intensified in areas impacted by widespread flooding (remote / regional areas) and will include increased social media and radio coverage in our region. SA Health have arranged for the distribution of larvicide for use by communities impacted by the recent flooding and free personal repellent is also being distributed to communities in affected areas including Andamooka.

So, if there are pools of water that are taking time to evaporate on your mining claim, residential property or perhaps the vacant place next door, or an area near you, please contact the office via the contacts below and we will arrange to either provide you with larvicide to safely attend to the problem yourself, or we will assist to have the pools treated.

The Town Office will also make personal insect repellent available at public facilities and those who are finding it difficult to afford the cost of this protection, we have a limited amount being delivered from SA Health to distribute out to disadvantaged community members.

For those who want to know more, the SA Health website also has a dedicated section relating to mosquito management which includes links to the monthly and annual South Australian arbovirus and mosquito monitoring reports, training videos for mosquito and mosquito larval surveillance and links to useful organisations. There is also a factsheet available '<u>Mosquito control on private land after floods and storms'</u>.

So, join us to Fight the Bite, and help prevent mosquito borne diseases occurring in our community. These can be debilitating, and in some cases deadly, so prevention is definitely worth the effort.



- You get your electricity bill at least every three months.
- Your bill describes what you are paying for.
- You have 12 business days to pay.
- You can ask your supplier to check your bill if you think it's wrong and get a fair response.
- You can pay your bill in person or by mail.
- Some people can also pay by direct debit or CentrePay.
- If you need help paying, you can ask to make a payment plan.
- If you make a payment plan and keep making payments, your electricity won't be cut off.

Interruptions



- You will get a written notice if your electricity will be off for a while.
- If you don't get a notice, you can ask why your electricity was off.

Disconnections



- If your electricity gets cut off because you haven't paid, you can make a payment plan.
- When you have made a payment plan, you can ask for your electricity to be put back on.
- You will get your electricity back that day or the next business day.

Complaints



- You can complain about your bill or service to your supplier.
- Your supplier must respond to your complaint within a month.
- If you are unhappy with their response, you can ask the SA Energy and Water Ombudsman to help. https://ewosa.com.au/

Prepaying for your electricity

Your electricity supplier may soon offer you the choice to prepay. With prepay, you pay for your electricity before you use it, instead of paying after you've used it and when you get your bill.

If you choose to prepay, your supplier must:



- explain how prepay works and tell you all the costs
- get your consent to prepay
- tell you how to use the prepay method on you meter, so you can see how much credit you have left
- give you some emergency credit if your prepayments run out
- keep your electricity connected on weekends and before 10am and after 3pm on weekdays, even when your prepayments and emergency credit have run out
- change you back to post-payment without any cost, so you can pay after you use your electricity.

On the 20th and 21st of December four separate fires were deliberately lit in the township. At about



Hot weather has bought out snakes & lizards so watch out for these creatures and make sure that you know what to do in the event of a snake bite.

This region is home to potentially deadly venomous snakes including the dark skinned Mulga and the Western Brown variations of which may be orange with a black head, or yellow head with greenish body, some have black bands. Don't confuse this with the harmless Desert Banded Snake which grows to only 40cm long, or the Ringed Brown which is venomous but not dangerous, growing up to 60cm.

A good practice is to keep a large, firm pressure bandage at hand in your car and home.
